
## Crown Borer

he crown borer is an insect pest throughout the Northwest. It burrows into the lower stems and crowns of the plant. Usually the damage is done during late winter and early spring. As the weather warms and the plant begins to grow, damaged and stressed canes begin dying. To control this pest, drench the crown with diazinon in late winter. Crown borers are particularly fond of red raspberries but also attack blackberries and their relatives.



EX Peaches. Vase. Peach trees set fruit on branches that grew the previous year. Remove about two thirds of new growth to keep crop from becoming overwhelming.

III Pears. Central leader. Prune to a pyramid shape. Do not prune too heavily as this will promote suckers.

Plums (Japanese). Vase. Requires heavy pruning to avoid excessive fruit set. Head back one-third to one-half of new growth.
